

CITY OF CROSSGATE MEETING
THOMAS JEFFERSON UNITARIAN CHURCH ANNEX
MONDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2010

The meeting came to order at 7:00 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Libby Gray, Mayor Elect Dan Grimm, Commissioners John Lepping, Larry Kirschenbaum, Anne Stanley-Hoffman and Bobby Hazen. The Treasurer, Tom Elmes, and City Clerk, Susan Dotson, were also present along with one resident.

The October minutes were approved first by Commissioner Hazen and second by Commissioner Lepping.

Treasurer Elmes reviewed the Treasurer's report with the Commissioners. Treasurer Elmes stated that the report was pretty standard, and the City property tax funds are starting to come in. The Treasurer also said the City received \$153.00 in May of 2010 from the Kentucky Litter Abatement fund. The city will investigate whether it can receive funds in 2011. The Treasurer's report was approved, first by Commissioner Hazen, and second by Commissioner Lepping.

Commissioners' Reports

Per Commissioner Lepping, no new information on roads, contracts, waste management, or landscaping at this time.

Per Commissioner Hoffman, she will contact Bill Conway and set up an appointment this month for the Clerk and herself to start mass e-mail communications.

Commissioner Hoffman is currently collecting information on building permits. Her contact at Metro Louisville is Mike Tackett.

There was also discussion of the potential for a Veteran's hospital on the Midlands property. Because of this Commissioner Hoffman will go to the Veterans Hospital on Zorn Ave. and count traffic.

Per Commissioner Kirschenbaum, he has the new "No Solicitation" signs and they will be posted by the time the City has its December meeting. The signs are white and black with reflective lettering. Commissioner Kirschenbaum will have a contractor put up some attractive posts, and have the post set in concrete.

Per Commissioner Hazen, no new information on city security at this time.

Per Commissioner Lepping, no new information on the PNC bank account.

Per Mayor Gray, Graymoor-Devondale did not approve the cost for wildlife control. Furthermore no one has seen the animals in weeks so the issue may have resolved itself. The matter has been tabled.

Per Commissioner Lepping, trash is piling up on the KABA property and he will call 311 to report what is believed to be illegal trash dumping.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Kirschenbaum will look into updating our directory records; it has been 2 years since the last city directory was published.

The Commissioners discussed the idea of setting up an Architectural Review Board to control future building construction in the city. Mayor Gray will contact our city attorney John Singler for advice.
