Commissioner Kirschenbaum stated he has purchased NO PARKING signs for the City. The signs can be recycled and used again. The signs will be used during the Annual Yard Sale and the Thomas Jefferson Art Fairs for road safety. The signs will be posted on one side of the street to make sure the street is wide enough for rescue vehicle to navigate the City streets if needed. Commissioner Kirschenbaum will also distribute a few new welcome baskets to our new City residents.
