MEETING OF MARCH 9, 2009

The meeting came to order at 7:00 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Pro-tem John Lepping and Commissioners Bobby Hazen, Larry Kirschenbaum and Anne Stanley Hoffman. The city Treasurer Tom Elmes was also present. Carol Hazen recorded the minutes because the City Clerk was out of town. The city also had a surprise visitor to the meeting, Kevin Baker from Lyndon Fire and Rescue.

The minutes from February were approved, 1<sup>st</sup> by Commissioner Hazen 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Kirschenbaum.

The Treasurer's report for February was also approved, 1<sup>st</sup> by Commissioner Hazen and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Hoffman.

Old Business:

Mayor Pro-tem Lepping said he would ask Duggin's to re-inspect all the mailboxes to make sure they all have been properly installed before the final payment is made for our new mailboxes.

An invitation for garbage contract bids will be put on the schedule for next month.

Landscapers Dwyer and Mainscape each gave an estimate on landscaping cost for the cities two entrances. Commissioner Hoffman made a motion to accept the Mainscape bid the motion was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Hazen. Motion approved.

We are still waiting for the additional dumpsters from Metro

Louisville to help in the January ice storm cleanup.

Commissioner Hoffman will look at a “ recognition of good neighbors proposal” so some of our city residents that helped out after the winter storm can be given thanks. The recognition will either be by our city newsletter or something placed in the Courier Journal.

The frequency and the method of reporting our Crossgate newsletter was discussed. One of the concerns is that about 1/3 of our city residents do not have email.

Commissioner Kirschenbaum is in the process of securing updated resident information for the new city directory. Commissioner Hoffman stated she would help out in the process.

Work is still in process for getting the new resident welcome basket together. Commissioners Kirschenbaum and Hoffman will work together to get a letter with the city official letter head to give to the businesses in Holiday Manor so they can give out special donations-discounts for our new residents.

Commissioner Hazen had no new information at this time.

New Business:

Treasurer Elmes reviewed the budget. There are no revisions at this time.

Capt. Kevin Baker of the Lyndon Fire and Rescue spoke at this time. He handed out a brief outline of what the Fire and Rescue department does, and what they can do for the city. Caption Baker also stated he would be available to come to future city meetings on the following dates, May 11, July 13, and Sept 14 of this year. Caption Baker was told that the council would talk to the Mayor and he can be put on the agenda at the appropriate time. That will also

give us time to let all our residents know that we will have a special guest speaker.
