

CITY OF CROSSGATE MEETING
THOMAS JEFFERSON UNITARIAN CHURCH ANNEX
MONDAY, MAY 14, 2012

The meeting came of order at 7:02 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Dan Grimm, Commissioners John Lepping, Bobby Hazen, Anne Stanley Hoffman and Larry Kirschenbaum. The Treasurer, Tom Elmes, and City Clerk, Susan Dotson were also present along with twelve City residents and others interested in information concerning the proposed VA Medical Center slated to be built at the Midlands project site.

The Treasurer's reports for February, March, and April were given by Tom Elmes. The reports were approved first by Commissioner Hazen and second by Commissioner Lepping. The Commission also voted to extend the terms of (money held in a) certificate of deposit (cd) for an additional 6 months, first by Commissioner Lepping and second by Commissioner Hazen. There was also a review of the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2012-2013. It was also noted that the hourly fee for Graymoor-Devondale police coverage has gone up from \$38.00 per hour to \$40.00.

The April minutes were approved, first by Commissioner Lepping and second by Commissioner Hazen.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Commissioner Lepping updated the Commissioners on the City road conditions; it was noted that the City roads, as a whole, are in good condition; however the entrances appeared to need some maintenance and he would contact Louisville Paving Co. to review of the condition of the roads at the entrances. Commissioner Lepping also stated that the City garbage contract will automatically renew this year at the same cost as last, so there is no need to bid for contracts.

Commissioner Hoffman stated that a resident has requested that the City change the City-wide garage sale to a date in August (before school starts) instead of the current date (a weekend in September). The Commission decided to move the sale date to August. Commissioner Hoffman also addressed the subject of the City wide picnic and if it should be continued this year or not in lieu of the low participation last year. This was tabled for further discussion

A City resident has expressed concern about another City resident parking their RV in their driveway which is against City bylaws; Mayor Grimm said he would address a letter to the resident in question.

Commissioner Kirschenbaum informed the Commission that the no parking signs the City put up for the Thomas Jefferson Spring Art Fair worked well and the City will continue to use them

for that event and next year's Kentucky Derby, which also involves a large number of on-street parking. Commissioner Kirschenbaum will also collect information on style and cost replacement for the current City signs for the meeting in June.

The Commission decided to keep the same company for snow removal for this coming winter season.

Commissioner Hazen reviewed the Graymoor-Devondale police report.

MIDLANDS UPDATE

An expanded traffic study is being conducted concerning the impact of the proposed VA Medical Center at the Midlands project site. The study should be done by the end of May.

When the NEPA study is completed the land transfer can take place, if approved.

Mayor Grimm and Commissioner will work with Constant Contact to keep the residents informed of any new information.

ORDINANCES

The first readings of the tax and budget ordinances for 2012-2013 were also completed.
