

CITY OF CROSSGATE MEETING  
THOMAS JEFFERSON UNITARIAN CHURCH ANNEX  
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 13, 2010

The meeting came to order at 7:01 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Pro-tem John Lepping, Commissioners Bobby Hazen, Larry Kirshenbaum and Anne Stanley Hoffman. The Treasurer Tom Elmes and city clerk Susan Dotson were also present.

The August minutes were approved as written first by Commissioner Hazen and second by Commissioner Kirschenbaum.

Treasurer Elmes reviewed the Treasurer's report with the Commissioners. Treasurer said the city has received about \$5300.00 income for the insurance tax the city collects. The report also reflected the payroll taxes paid and \$300.00 paid annually to Thomas Jefferson or the church annex rental. Treasures Elmes and the Commissioners held a discussion on which city fund to use to pay for the recent road paying Agreement was reached as fallows.

\$7,000.00 from the Now Road Account

\$12,000.00 from the Business Road Account

Balance from the Now General Account

The city also had a CD which will mature in September and Commissioners decided to have the CD roll over for a six month period.

The Treasurer's report was approved, first by commissioner Kirschenbaum and second by Commissioner Hazen.

Commissioner Hazen will contact State Representative Bob DeWeese to see if the Crossgate is eligible for any state fund for repaying our city streets.

The city clerk informed Commissioners that she has some paperwork from Insight concerning our franchise renewal. She informed the Commissioners that messages have been left with Insight but the called had not yet been returned. Commission Lepping volunteered to assist if the clerk continued to communication problems

OLD BUSINESS

Per Commissioner Lepping, no new information on Landscaping or WM.

Per Commissioner Hoffman the city wide yard sale went well and about 32-38 residents showed up for the picnic. Commissioner Hoffman stated she will be in contact with the Web designer to set up training classes for the City Clerk and herself.

Commissioner Lepping we hirer a city resident to help put out the quartly newsletter. The Commissioners agreed to contact residents they thought might be interested and decided the pay of \$50.00-\$75.00 would be appreciate.

Mayor Gray arrived at 7:40 p.m.

Commissioner Kirshenbaum said he and Commissioner Hazen will be delivering 3 more welcome baskets this month.

The city had new yard sale signed made this year and Commissioner Hazen along with Mr. Hoffman put them up. The new signs are designed in such a way the city can use them year after year with no modification.

Per Commissioner Kirshenbaum the city can order new NO SOLICITATION signs for \$18.50 each. The new signs will be black and white, metal and measurer 18Wx12H.

Per Commissioner Hazen, a stolen car was found in your city last month. The car had been stolen from Holiday Manor parking lot.

Commissioner Lepping is still working on the PNC account fallow-up.
