MONDAY, APRIL 11, 2011

The meeting came to order at 7:02 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Dan Grimm, Commissioners Bobby Hazen, Anne Stanley Hoffman, Larry Kirschenbaum and John Lepping. Treasurer Tom Elmes and Clerk Susan Dotson were also present.

The March minutes were approved as written, first by Commissioner Hazen and second by Commissioner Kirschenbaum.

The Treasurer's report, given by Treasurer Tom Elmes was approved, first by Commissioner Hoffman and second by Commissioner Hazen. Treasurer Elmes informed the Commission that the road funds have come in and that all City property tax issues residents have been resolved.

Commissioner Hazen informed the Commission that there was one attempted house break-in in the City during the month of March.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Per Commissioner Lepping, he will contract Class A Lawn Services to increase the City front entrances weed control. In addition, Commissioner Lepping will get a quote, per unit, for snow removal and salting of the City roads for the next winter season.

Per Commissioner Hoffman, she asks the Commissioners to consider one summer picnic this year for the city social activities, instead of two, due to attendance of last year's two picnics.

Commissioner Kirschenbaum brought in the "No Solicitation" signs for the Commission to view. The Commission decided, that if, the "No Solicitation" signs will fit on the Cities existing poles we will use them and he will return the two poles that he purchased for the signs posting.

Per Commissioner Kirschenbaum, the new City Directories are almost ready for proofing.

Per City Clerk Susan Dotson, her web-site training for the City web-site has been completed.

NEW BUSINESS

It was reported that a resident has recently seen a coyote on the Midlands property.

Discussion of a proposed building permit approval ordinance for City Residents considering a house addition/renovation was tabled until the May meeting.

Per the Commission, Mr. Grady Throneberry, Graymoor-Devondale Chief of Police will be invited to attend our May meeting to discuss the status of current police protection for the City, explain the specifics of their monthly police reports to the City, and the possibilities of increasing the City police coverage.

The Commission reviewed a preliminary City budget for fiscal year 2011-2012.

A discussion on assignment of commissioner duties was tabled until the May meeting.
