MEETING OF JULY 12, 2010

T.J. UNITARIAN CHURCH ANNEX

The meeting came to order at 7:04 p.m. Present at the meeting Mayor Libby Gray and Commissioners Bobby Hazen, Larry Kirschenbaum, and Anne Stanley Hoffman. Treasurer Tom Elmes and Clerk Susan Dotson were also present.

Treasurer Elmes stated the treasurer's report for June was standard, and noted the payroll and equipment rental is reflected in the June report. Commissioner Kirschenbaum noted that the income for the 2009-2010 fiscal year was more than budgeted. Treasurer Elmes explained that was due to property tax re-evaluations and insurance income. Commissioner Hazen moved to approve the budget first, and Commissioner Kirschenbaum seconded. Treasurer Elmes also noted that the cost to join the Jefferson County League of Cities has gone up. Mayor Gray elected not to renew.

The minutes for June were approved with grammar and spelling corrections: first by Commissioner Hazen and second by Commissioner Hoffman

OLD BUSINESS

Per information obtained from Commissioner Lepping, Louisville Sealing Coating has sent in a revised quote for resealing and general maintenance of the city roads. The quote is \$19,400.00. Commissioner Hazen moved to approve the expenditure first, and Commissioner Hoffman seconded.

Per Commissioner Hoffman, no new information on social activities. The Commissioners decided that for the city yard sale, the city would advertise on Craig's List, in the Courier Journal and put out signs at both entrances to the city. Mayor Gray suggested that we put out reminders about the city wide yard sale and the 2nd city picnic in our news letter along with information about the road sealing when we have firm dates for the project. Mayor Gray also suggest we put information in the news letter about the

new “no solicitation” ordinance.

Per Commissioner Kirschenbaum, no new beautification information and two welcome baskets were distributed to new residents in the past month.

Per Commissioner Hazen, no homes are for sale at this time in the city.

NEW BUSINESS

The first reading of the no solicitation ordinance was completed.

Commissioner Kirschenbaum addressed the issue of foxes in the city that some residents have raised concerns about. Per Commissioner Kirschenbaum, the information he collected from A ALL ANIMAL CONTROL, which is an animal control company, is to do nothing, and leave the foxes alone. The Jefferson County Animal Control said the same thing. Commissioner Kirschenbaum also contacted CRITTER RIDDERS and they also said to leave the foxes alone. If however, we insisted on removing the foxes the cost would be \$200.00 up front and \$69.00 per fox.

Commissioner Lepping is still looking into the old city funds from PNC.
