

**CITY OF CROSSGATE
MEETING OF JUNE 8, 2009
T. J. UNITARIAN CHURCH ANNEX**

The meeting came to order a 7:01 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Libby Gray and Commissioners Bobby Hazen, Larry Kirschenbaum, John Lepping and Anne Stanley Hoffman. The city Clerk was also present.

The minutes from May were approved, 1st by Commissioner Hazen and 2nd by Commissioner Lepping.

The Treasurer's report for May was also approved, 1st by Commissioner Hazen and 2nd by Commissioner Kirschenbaum.

Commissioner Hazen has gotten the broken road sign fixed. Commissioner Lepping will pick it up and have it remounted to the signpost.

Commissioner Lepping was able to negotiate a new Waste Management contract; the cost will be the same as last year. Commissioner Hazen made a motion to accept the new contract, all approved.

The summer flowers have been planted but do not look good . Commissioner Lepping will speak to the landscaper. The sprinkler system also needs to be reprogrammed. Currently it comes on 3 times a week for 5 minutes. Commissioner Lepping will reprogram for 7 minutes per day. The ornamental grass is also too high and needs to be cut back because it is stopping the sprinkler system from working properly. One row of ornamental grass will be moved back so the flowers can get water.

Commissioner Lepping stated the roads still need attention.

Mayor Gray stated the Browenton meeting went well.

Commissioner Hoffman stated the 1st summer picnic will be this weekend and the announcement is on our web site and flyers have been sent out.

Commissioners Hoffman and Kirschenbaum will compare e-mail lists before the next meeting to help keep the list current and clean.

It has been reported there is a den of foxes living on the church property. E-mail will be sent out for residents to keep in their small animals at night.

The Midlands property has been plowed and the Providence Point property will be bush hogged but we are not sure when.

Commissioner Kirshenbaum said the new directory is ready for publication and he is still working on the welcome baskets.

Council voted to continue the police service the city has hired. 1st by Commissioner Lepping, 2nd by Commissioner Hoffman all approved.

Two homes have sold in Crossgate over the last month.

Council voted to go by the record retention suggestions from the Kentucky Commonwealth.

One resident has had a guest parking on both sides of the road on a regular basis. Mayor Gray will send out a letter reminding the resident the city has an ordinance against this and it is a safety issue for rescue vehicles.
