

CITY OF CROSSGATE
MEETING OF JUNE 14, 2010
T.J. UNITARIAN CHURCH ANNEX

The meeting came to order at 7 p.m. Present at the meeting Mayor Libby Gray and Commissioners Bobby Hazen, John Lepping, Anne Stanley-Hoffman and Larry Kirschenbaum. Treasurer Tom Elmes and Clerk Susan Dotson were also present, as well one guest.

Treasurer Elmes stated the treasurer's report for May was standard, and noted that the annual F65 report has been complete and paid for, and was a \$300.00 expense. He also noted that long term Capital Improvements had funds to cover the entrance electrical work that was needed.

The second reading for Ordinance 02 series 2010-2011(budget) was given by Mayor Gray. Commissioner Hazen first by and Commissioner second by and all approved. The ordinances would be published consistent with municipal law.

The minutes for May were approved as written first by Commissioner Lepping and second by Commissioner Hazen.

Commissioner Lepping stated he had received an adjusted bill from Main Scape for the entrances and gave the bill to the Treasurer to be paid.

Commissioner Lepping also informed the Commission that he has gotten estimates from 2 different paving companies for resealing the roads and making repairs where needed. After discussion with Commission and Mayor, Commissioner Lepping will contact the companies to see if the price quoted can be adjusted downward before a final decision is make.

Officer Baker from the Lyndon Fire Department informed the Commission that the Fire Department was having town hall meeting June 23rd about the need of funds for fire protection. He invited the Commission to come.

Commissioner Hoffman said about 30-35 residents showed up for the first city picnic this year. Because of the heat, she held the picnic at her house, which worked out well.

Commissioner Hazen gave out information on new residents and informed Commissioners and Mayor that another home in the city will be rented.

A Resident had expressed a concern about foxes being in the neighborhood. No residents were present to discuss. Mayor Gray had consulted with two other area Mayors who said they have not had this problem and never taken any action to rid their neighborhoods of an animal such as a fox. After discussion, it was decided that nothing would be done at this time.

The city does not have a (NO Solicitation) ordinance and Commissioners decided it was needed; Mayor Gray will consult with the City attorney John Singler who will draft a copy for the next monthly meeting.
