Ordinance 2025-08 Commercial Vehicle Parking Ordinance

WHEREAS, the City of Crossgate owns and maintains certain rights of way in the City and because of that ownership, the City has the right to regulate parking upon that right of way to insure the safe and efficient use of the right of way for the public;

AND WHEREAS, the City of Crossgate Legislative Body has determined that the City will adopt Chapter 72 (Parking Regulations) of the Louisville Metro Code of Ordinances and the original 1961 Crossgate Deed Restrictions.

Whereas, the City of Crossgate Legislative Body has determined that unregulated parking on the City right of way is a public health and safety concern due to the narrowness of the roadway and that further unregulated parking detracts from the overall attractiveness of the City and therefore detracts from property values,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City of Crossgate Legislative Body,

DEFINITIONS: For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms, words and phrases shall have the following meanings, respectively:

Commercial Vehicle: As used herein "commercial-type vehicle" shall mean a motor vehicle meeting any one of the following classifications:

- 1) Vehicles with a GVWR of 10,001 pounds or more as indicated on the manufacturer's VIN plate.
- 2) Objects/framework of any kind (e.g. but not limited to ladder racks, tools, payload) designed to extend beyond the original height measured from the top of the roof may not extend more than 30 inches.
- 3) Vehicles originally sold as a "chassis" for the specific purpose of "up-fitting or modifying" for any purpose.

Motor Vehicle: A devise that has its own motorized power, and that is used for transporting people, things, materials, supplies, and other items on and over public streets. The term includes, but is not limited to, motorcycles, motorbikes, motor scooters, passenger vehicles.

Section 1 - Service and Repair: The making of repairs to or the replacement of major parts or systems of a Commercial Vehicle, such as body and fender repair and replacement, painting, engine or transmission removal or replacement, or any work using welders, torches, or air driven power tools, as well as minor service and repair, such as tune-up, replacement and servicing of oil and other fluids, and replacement and adjustment of minor parts such as tires, hoses, belts, filters, fuses, and similar items is not permitted.

Section 2 – Limitation on Overnight Parking. No person shall park, or otherwise let or leave standing any Commercial Vehicle within the City any day from 0100 - 0700.

Section 3 – Parking Exemptions. Commercial vehicles that can be parked behind the primary residential structure are exempt.

Section 4 - The fact that any vehicle which is illegally parked is registered in the name of any individual or entity shall constitute prima facie proof that such person or entity was in control of the vehicle when it was parked or left standing.

Section 4 – Severability. If any provision of this ordinance is found to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be severed, and the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect following its adoption and publication.

Section 6 – Repeal of conflicting ordinances

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.


NOW THEREFORE, the City of Crossgate does ordain as follows:


